Who is a Master Gardener?

A Master Gardener is a trained volunteer who aids University of Wisconsin Extension Staff by helping people in the community better understand horticulture and their environment.

Master Gardeners help educate local community members in applying horticultural science to manage their landscapes and gardens in a science-based, sustainable manner.



Achieving Master Gardener Certification requires attending all 10 training sessions, passing the final exam and completing 24 hours of volunteer service within one year of completing the training course. The Master Gardener General Certification Course is \$70/person (\$110 for two if sharing materials) which includes approximately 30 hours of classroom and hands on instruction, the Master Gardener Training Manual, and printed materials. Scholarships are available. Classroom sessions will be held from 6-9pm at Northland College. Sign up soon, registration is limited to 30!
