

## DEPARTMENT 3-J JUNIOR FAIR SWINE

### Entry Requirements:

1. Limited to exhibitors enrolled in the Swine Project.
2. Must provide Premises ID number on online entry and on check-in day of Fair.
3. Please review the fairbook State Animal Health Rules and Regulations section for applicable rules.
4. Health papers are required according to State Animal Health Rules. Swine purchased in a state other than Wisconsin must have health papers on file at weigh-in and at the Fair.
5. Market swine may be barrows or gilts. **An exhibitor may enter no more than 1 hog.** All market swine will be weighed Thursday of the Fair.
6. If 16 or more animals are entered in any class, that class may be divided into two or more approximately equal subclasses and each subclass may be judged as a separate class.
7. After the weigh-in process is complete, each market swine will be assigned to the appropriate lot.
8. All meat animal exhibitors must complete the Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) Level III training every year to be eligible to sell their animal(s) at the Buffalo County Fair and one additional approved educational session. (See Buffalo County Junior Livestock Sale Rules for a list of approved educational sessions.)
9. To be eligible for sale swine must grade a 1 or 2, and weigh at least 230 pounds on entry day. Swine that exceed the 300 pound mark can still be sold at the sale, but the Exhibitor will only receive the sale price for 300 pounds.
10. All animals must be accompanied by a responsible person to assist with weighing in at the time of arrival at the fairgrounds. All meat animals will be weighed in at the Fair between 7:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, entry day. The animal will be placed in the appropriate weight class at the time of weigh-in on entry day by the Livestock Sale Committee.
11. **\*\*Market Swine will be slaughtered on Tuesday following the fair. Feed pans need to be left with the market swine and can be picked up on Tuesday after the swine have left.\*\***
12. Swine should not be shaved.
13. Swine showing any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease will not be permitted to be exhibited.
14. **To exhibit at the Buffalo County Fair:**
  - All market animals must be owned by the exhibitor.
  - Non-market animals may be ownership or managerial.
15. **To exhibit at the Wisconsin State Fair:** Please Note: The Wisconsin State Fair has very specific entry requirements and deadlines. If you are interested in entering animals in the Wisconsin State Fair, please contact the UW-Extension Office by March 15 for a list of entry guidelines and deadlines.
16. The final market destination for all market animals must be determined prior to Saturday at 5:00 p.m. No changes allowed after that time
17. Close toed footwear must be worn by exhibitor while caring for or exhibiting animals.

Market swine will be judged on weight division only (light, medium or heavy).
