State Natural Areas protect examples of native natural communities, significant geological formations, and archaeological sites. They harbor natural features unaltered by human-caused disturbances or that have recovered from disturbance over time. Natural areas are not appropriate for camping or mountain biking, but they can accommodate low-impact activities such as hiking, bird watching, and nature study. SNAs contain few or no amenities such as parking areas, restrooms, or maintained trails.

A limited number of properties allow additional outdoor recreation at designated locations like camping, bicycling, horseback riding, and snowmobiling.
