Purpose

- * To promote the 4-H program and develop leadership skills

Responsibilities

Reach the public with the 4-H Story

- * Television programs
- * Radio programs
- * Promotion at schools
- * Represent 4-H in area parades
- * Talk to community groups
- * Fair

Create 4-H understanding within the organization

- * Visit clubs and provide education
- * Work with leaders and members
- * Inform 4-H'ers and 4-H leaders of the activities you are involved in as an Ambassador

Assist with 4-H event logistics

- * Welcome participants to 4-H events (Pump House, Clover College, etc.)
- * Emcee events: Achievement Celebration, Music/Arts & Crafts Festival, Communication Arts Festival, etc.
- * Usher at events
- * Present awards and ribbons at events
- * Clerk at Fair
- * And others as specified by advisors

Time commitment:

- ★ One 4-H year (November 2016 – September 2017)
- ★ Various events and activities throughout the year
- ★ One Ambassador meeting per month (currently held on the first Tuesday evening)

Qualifications:

- ★ Be in 9th-12th grade for the 4-H year you will be representing
- ★ Knowledgeable about 4-H
- ★ Possess good communications skills
- ★ Have a desire to promote 4-H

To Be Selected as an Ambassador, you need to:

New applicants:

- ★ Submit an Application Form
- ★ Interview

Reapplying applicants:

- ★ must express their interest in re-applying prior to the application due date
 - ~ this needs to be in a written format: email, mail or fax are acceptable
- ★ will complete a different leadership task that replaces an interview
 - ~ some examples are: news releases, media spots, speeches, presentations, etc
