## What is 4-H?

4-H is a youth organization of boys and girls sharing, doing, and learning together in all kinds of projects, events, and activities. 4-H members are guided by volunteer adult leaders, parents, and UW Extension staff. Members choose projects that fit their personal interests. Both rural and urban youth enjoy the merits of the 4-H program. Families enjoy the meaningful time together through a variety of events.

## Who can join 4-H?

Membership is open to all boys and girls kindergarten through one year past high school graduation. 4-H is open to all youth regardless of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or handicap.
