

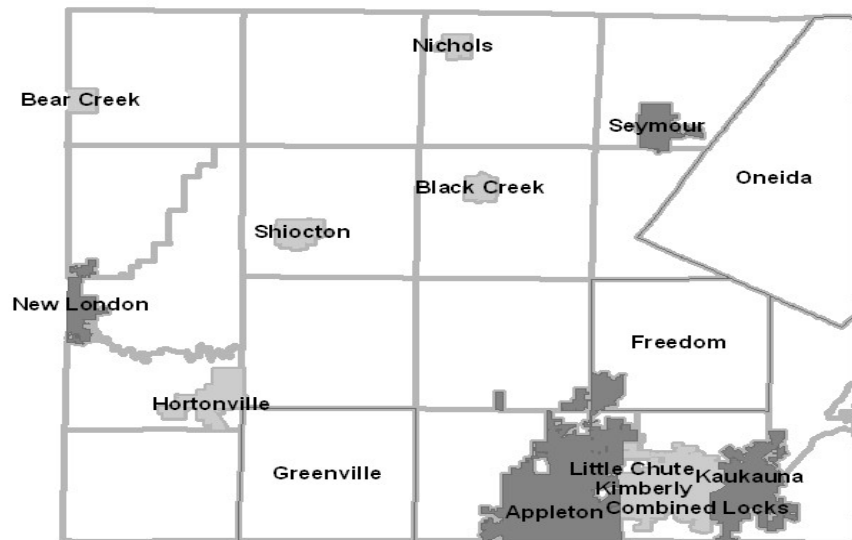
Mission Statement:
