## General rules:

1. **Entry Fees** are due April 30 and are non-refundable. Late entry fees apply after April 30 and are non-refundable. Completed 2017 NCWCA Beef Preview Show Entry Forms (one form for each exhibitor) are due with total fee payment. Entries submitted without payment will not be accepted and exhibitor will be informed of non-acceptance by a phone call from the committee.
2. The North Central Wisconsin Cattlemen's Association and/or its members, and/or volunteers for the NCWCA Beef Preview Show are not liable or responsible for any accidents or losses during this event.
3. There are No Limits on the number of animals one exhibitor can show.
4. Six head are required to maintain a breed division. The Show Committee will designate the divisions when there are not six present of a particular breed.
5. Final classes will be determined after all entries are checked in.
6. Registration paper and certificate meeting the requirements of a breed association are required for purebred animals.
7. All cattle must have individual identification; acceptable forms of ID include 1) USDA metal ear (NUES tag or 'brite' tag), 2) your county's market animal tag, or 3) tattoo.
8. All cattle must be dehorned.
9. All cattle must be free of ringworm, warts, or other infectious disease.
10. All cattle must be under control of the exhibitor at all times. If animal causes damage, it will be banned from the show.
8. All cattle must meet Wisconsin health requirements, which include:
  - Cattle from within WI have no requirements for tests or health documents.
  - Cattle originating from outside of Wisconsin must be accompanied by certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) documenting official ID (including steers) and all required test and certifications (meeting WI normal import requirements). The CVI must be issued within 30 days of arrival and show the complete description of livestock as to age, sex, breed, and individual identification such as tattoo or ear tag; also must show the animals are free of external parasites, ringworm, or warts, and any infectious, contagious or communicable disease. ### 9. Barn Rules:

- Barn stalls will NOT be assigned. Stalls are on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Electrical power is limited; we encourage the use of generators; however, they are not allowed in the barn.
- Water is available, but wash rack area is limited; wash your cattle prior to arrival. Spot washing only allowed in the barn.
- For the biosecurity of your animals, do not share feeding, watering, or grooming equipment with other cattle.
- No grooming chutes allowed in barns until check-in and weigh-in times close.
- There will be no smoking in the barns by exhibitors/visitors.
- Exhibitors must clean their stall and/or area (s) before leaving:
  - A fee of \$25 will be charged if your stall is not cleaned up when they leave.
  - Should you choose to stall and fit from your trailer, you MUST clean up your bedding. You will be charged \$25.00 if area not cleaned up when you leave.
  - Bring your own bedding and plan to take it home with you. Bagged shavings will be available for a fee.

### 10. Fitting Rule:

All fitting must be done by the exhibitor or member of their family. No professional fitting allowed.



## Showmanship Rules: This is a Jackpot event

- The exhibitor must use their own animal in showmanship and said animal must be entered in the NCWCA Beef Preview Show.
- There are four age groups, Beginner 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, Senior 14-16, and Advanced 17- 22 years old, as of January 1st of the current show year. List age and grade in school on the Entry Form.
- Winners of the intermediate, senior and advanced classes compete for the Jackpot: 1st gets half the pot, 2nd & 3rd split the remaining pot equally. Competing beginners will receive a prize.

## Heifer Rules: The Heifer show is open to both youth and adults.

- All heifers must have individual identification; acceptable forms of ID include USDA metal ear NUES tag ('brite' tag), or registration tattoo.
- All heifers will be shown by age within breed or commercial classes.
- Purebred females must be recorded through a national breed association, and carry a legible tattoo corresponding with the registration papers. You must present the animal's registration paper and breed association certificate to show in a breed class.
- Low percentage heifers, heifers without papers, and crossbred heifers will be shown as a commercial breed.
- All heifers must be born during the following times:
  - Junior Calf (heifer or bull): born on or after January 1 of current year
  - Senior Heifer Calf: born on or between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31 of the year preceding the show year.
  - Summer Yearling Heifer: born on or between May 1 and Aug. 31 of the year preceding the show year.
  - Junior Yearling Heifer: born on or between Jan. 1 and April 30 of the year preceding the show year.
  - Senior Yearling Heifer: born on or between Sept 1 and Dec. 31 of second year preceding the show year.
  - Cow/Calf Pair Cow: cow born on or between Sept. 1 and two years preceding the show year, with calf born after Jan 1 of current year at side. The pair shows as one entry.
    - May split to show them separately.
- Heifer classes will be broken by breed, with six (6) animals minimum per class. Class determination will be at the discretion of the Show Committee when there are fewer than six animals of a breed; mixed pure-bred classes may be used.
- Final classes will be determined by the Show Committee after all entries are checked in.

## Steer Rules: Steer show is a junior show only.

- ◆ All steers must be born after January 1 of the previous year.
- ◆ All steers must have individual identification; acceptable forms of ID include USDA metal ear NUES tag ('brite' tag), your county's market animal tag, or tattoo.
- ◆ A registration paper or breed association certificate must be presented to show in a breed class; if no papers are presented, steers will show in the crossbred class.
- ◆ Dairy steers, (Holstein, Jersey, Guernsey, Brown Swiss and Ayrshire only) will be shown in their own class
- ◆ All steers will be shown by weight.
- ◆ Steer classes will be broken by breed, six (6) head minimum per class. Class determination will be at the discretion of the Show Committee when there are fewer than six animals of a breed; mixed pure-bred classes may be used.
- ◆ Final classes will be determined by the Show Committee after all entries are checked in.
