

Creating Personal Respect Posters

Description: They youth can decorate a piece of paper however they want.

Purpose: It's a way to show people that you like different things than them and that they shouldn't always follow what their best friend is doing or other people.

Time: 20-30 minutes

Age/Grade Level: 5k-5th grade

Suggestions: This can be used during the meeting to keep youth engaged as you are discussing other business.

Materials:

- Paper
- Different colored markers
- Crayons
- Scissors (optional)
- Construction Paper (optional)
- Glue (optional)

What to do:

1. After the pledges and the treasurer's and secretary's reports, you can explain what they can do about decorating a piece of paper of their choice. The paper should represent them. They should use the stuff that is on their table instead of moving around to different tables. If your club doesn't use tables, tell them to grab a few markers or crayons to draw on the paper.
2. During the time you would have the activity, you can have some of them come up and show what their poster looks like or they can share with the people around the table they sit at or around where they are sitting. If they are still working on it, they can work on it until the end of the meeting.

Reflection Questions:

1. Why is everyone's poster different?
2. What's one thing that represents them that they drew on their paper?
